Overview:

Prior to 1750

Most people lived in small villages. Making their own products of living (tools, clothes, and food). Their economy was **traditional**, based on agriculture and peasant **subsistence farming**. A family was given a small strip of land within the manor that contained their village. This style of life was similar to that of the medieval times, as peasant way of life had not changed much. Farming practices utilized the open-field system, also known as the **3-field system**. This method, though good for **subsistence**, was not sufficient to support a *growing population* and a higher demand for **capital**.


